Paper formatting instructions

- Title: in Title Case, left aligned
- Author information (separately for every author) Full name
Affiliation
Address
E-mail
- Section headings and subsection headings, headings of tables and figures:
in Title Case; left aligned; numbered
- Line spacing: Single
- Text alignment: Justified
- Paragraphs: No space between paragraphs
First line of paragraph indented (1.25 cm) starting from the
second paragraph of each section
Empty line after each section, section heading, subsection,
subsection heading, table and figure
- Tables and Figures to be included in the main text
- Sources and Notes to Tables and Figures: Left aligned; Italic
- Notes: As footnotes; referred to with Arabic numbers in the text
- Style of references in the text:

Smith (2002), Black et al. (2009), Apple and Plum (2010) or
(Apple & Plum, 2010; Black et al., 2009; Smith, 2002;)

When cited work has three to five authors, 1st citation should include the names of all authors and every subsequent citation just the name of the first author followed by “et al.”.

In case of six or more authors, cite only the name of the first author followed by “et al.” whenever the work appears in the text.

- Style of the list of references¹:

Journal article

In case of journal articles with seven or fewer authors, all of them should be listed in the reference.

In case of eight or more authors, only the first six authors should be listed, followed by three dots (...), and then by the name of the last author.

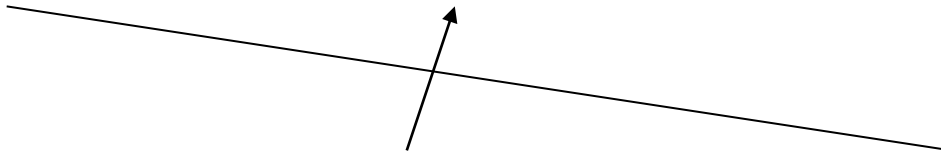
